Aviation—Specializing in operating single and twin engine aircraft in remote areas and places where alternative modes of transportation are impractical or unavailable.

Communications—Communications services to isolated areas worldwide: email, HF/VHF radios, VSAT broadband Internet access, and networking solutions.

Learning Technologies—Strategic distance learning tools and support to help meet the critical need for trained indigenous community leaders in developing countries.

Transportation

- ◆ Relief workers to disaster sites
- ◆ Teachers and medical personnel to remote areas
- ◆ Food, seed, and equipment to isolated villages
- ◆ Crops, livestock, and goods delivered to markets

Community Development

In fiscal year 2008, PACTEC executed 2,126 flights, transported 9,675 passengers, and delivered 316,554 pounds of cargo in order to provide access to basic services such as health clinics, medical emergency evacuations, and education.

PACTEC planes saved humanitarian workers 5,197 days of travel time—or 21.5 productive work years—redeemed for compassionate, people-centered humanitarian service!

Additionally, PACTEC-Learning Technologies (PACTEC-LT) responded to training needs by providing vision, consulting, leadership, and the necessary technology for training and equipping indigenous community leaders through distance education and digital publishing.

The goal of PACTEC-LT is to see technology-supported distance education take its place as an effective tool in the repertoire of all organizations seeking to prepare rapidly growing numbers of community leaders in the countries where they work.

PACTEC deploys a full range of aviation, communications, and distance education services to maximize humanitarian efforts in eight countries: Mauritania, Senegal, Laos, Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, China, Kyrgyzstan, and one middle eastern country.
